We are proud to launch this borderless initiative to consolidate a long-term agenda to ensure a green and responsible transition from Tennis.


We are facing the defining challenge of our time, so we invite the media, brands and the entire tennis ecosystem to work together to achieve it.

# ATP AND ITF COMMITMENTS BEFORE U.N. SPORTS FOR CLIMATE ACTION

#### ATP WITH RACE TO ZERO 2040

In November 2021, ATP became a signatory UN Sports for Climate Action (UNSCA), setting ambitious sustainability targets for men's professional tennis. This major international framework counts over 250 sports rights holders and governing bodies as signatories and aligns the industry in working towards the <2°C warming target set in the Paris Agreement.

#### SUSTAINABILITY AT THE ITF

The ITF has entered an agreement with AQ Green Tec, which seeks to invest into development-stage renewable energy and is exploring the field of climate neutrality and green power - in particular with regard to developing and marketing solutions for the measurement, reduction and offsetting of carbon emissions. This project will align the ITF's sustainability objectives with the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), Sports for Climate Action Framework (SCAF) and the International Olympic Committee's sustainability strategy.




### **GLOBAL CAMPAIGNS**

We have decided to create an unprecedented campaign together with reputable communications agencies to amplify our conservation and decarbonization efforts to reinforce the Montreal Pact and the UN-backed global Race to Zero campaign.

A match in the Amazon in 2024 and another in Antarctica in 2025 will generate unprecedented global visibility.

The alarm about biodiversity loss, melting ice, as well as pollution and contamination — as reported by the IPCC (Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change), needs an immediate call to action.








### PLANET POSITIVE

Planet positive<sup>©</sup> compensations enable products and activities to make the planet a better place. By doubly compensating their Ecological Footprint, they turn those products and activities' negative impact into a positive contribution of equal size.

#### **QUALITY AND ACCOUNTABILITY**

Planet positive® adheres to the highest accounting and compensation standards, including those for carbon credits, to make sure the certification delivers on its promise. Compensations used for planet positive must: avoid double counting (for instance, carbon reductions must not be counted elsewhere); be socially beneficial (benefits have to flow back to communities that manage the ecosystems); be guaranteed over long time frames (not just temporary); and be traceable as every provided planet positive seal is registered on this planet positive website.









### THE EARTH CUP AT CLIMATE WEEK MIAMI


The Earth Cup will be held annually, on one day, during the week of April 22-28 as part of Miami Climate Week.

This event will be televised and will feature high-level matches with at least one #1 player on the court.

Miami is "ground zero" for climate change. A single county is home to 26% of the homes threatened by sea level rise in the United States, a fact that exemplifies the complicated struggle Florida faces against global warming.

The Earth Cup is intended to raise funds for the Tennis Race to Zero Foundation and to accelerate its strategic plan towards 2030.

Key Biscayne will be the stage to give visibility to the climate crisis the planet is experiencing.





#### TENNIS RACE TO ZERO SUMMIT AT COP29



The event convenes all industry players to present reports, solutions and new actions at each Climate Summit. COP29 is a major global event that will host high-level participation, including more than 140 Heads of State, senior government leaders, over 80,000 delegates and more than 5,000 media professionals.

The 2024 UN Climate Change Conference (UNFCCC COP 29) will convene in November 2024. It will include the 29th session of the Conference of the Parties (COP 29), the 19th meeting of the COP serving as the Meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (CMP 19), and the sixth meeting of the COP serving as the Meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA 6) that will convene to complete the first enhanced transparency framework and the new collective quantified goal on finance, among other matters. The 61st sessions of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA 61) and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI 61) will also meet.
